The employee's personal mileage is taxable as a benefit. 3. Stock options may be taxable to employees when the option is received, or when the option is exercised, or when the stock is disposed of. 4. Employee bonuses and awards for outstanding work are generally taxable to the employee.

## Employer Guide: What Employee Compensation Is Taxable?

Of course, there are exceptions to every rule. Salaried individuals who earn less than \$23,660 per year often qualify for additional compensation, including overtime pay, per the FLSA's standard for non-exempt salaried employees. In this situation, employers have to pay overtime, despite the employee being salaried.

You can deduct an employee bonus as long as you can show the IRS that the bonus was directly tied to specific work that the employee did. Up to a maximum of \$1,600 per employee, you can deduct two kinds of employee awards: length of service awards, and safety achievement awards.

Compensation - is the tax withheld from income payments to individuals arising from an employer-employee relationship. Expanded - is a kind of withholding tax which is prescribed on certain income payments and is creditable against the income tax due of the payee for the taxable quarter/year in which the particular income was earned.

If the recipient of a taxable fringe benefit is your employee, the benefit is generally subject to

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employment taxes and must be reported on Form W-2, Wage and Tax Statement. However, you can use special rules to withhold, deposit, and report the employment taxes. These rules are discussed in section 4.
