Nichiren (日蓮; born as Zen-nichi-maro (日蓮丸), Dharma name: Rencho, 16 February 1222 – 13 October 1282) was a Japanese Buddhist priest of the Kamakura period (1185–1333), who developed the teachings of Nichiren Buddhism, a branch school of Mahayana Buddhism.

Nichiren believed that the quintessence of the Buddha's teachings is contained in the Lotus Sutra (Sanskrit: Saddharmapundarika-sutra; "The Scripture of the Lotus of the Good Law").
