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Second, precepting was both challenging and rewarding. The challenges involved the student, the context, and the preceptors' own teaching and learning skills, resulting in feelings of frustration and conflict between nursing care and preceptor roles. Precepting is crucial in retaining new nurses and helping

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Effective preceptor education should allow exploration of novel precepting challenges, either in carefully designed scenarios or anecdotal reports from participants. The goal of reflection on action is to highlight what preceptors gain from their experience that contributed to their ongoing professional development and to build capacity for clinical judgment in future situations.

Preceptor education: Focusing on quality and safety ...

All of the participants were prepared for their preceptorship, teaching, and assessment, but wanted to expand their knowledge and skills to be able to further develop as a preceptor. The mean age of the preceptors was 43 years, ranging from 25-63 years, and they had been working as preceptors in a clinical setting from between 5-20 years by this time.
