Review of Dilution, Concentration, and Stock Solutions . A dilution is a solution made by adding more solvent to a more concentrated solution (stock solution), which reduces the concentration of the solute.An example of a dilute solution is tap water, which is mostly water (solvent), with a small amount of dissolved minerals and gasses (solutes).

Stock Solutions. It is often necessary to have a solution whose concentration is very precisely known. Solutions containing a precise mass of solute in a precise volume of solution are called stock (or standard) solutions.To prepare a standard solution a piece of lab equipment called a volumetric flask should be used.

5 Common Inventory Mistakes and How to Avoid Them

Problem #1: If you dilute 175 mL of a 1.6 M solution of LiCl to 1.0 L, determine the new concentration of the solution. Solution: $M_1 V_1 = M_2 V_2$ (1.6 mol/L) (175 mL) = (x) (1000 mL) $x = 0.28$ M. Note that 1000 mL was used rather than 1.0 L. Remember to keep the volume units consistent.

A stock or standard solution is a solution in which you accurately know its concentration. You can make stock solutions in the chemistry laboratory or buy from chemical manufacturers. Once you have a stock solution, you can prepare solutions of lower concentration by diluting the concentrated stock solution.

How to prepare a solution from stock solution

So to prepare the solution, add 67 mL of 1.5 M stock solution to 433 mL water. Mix and enjoy! Try another problem: What is the final concentration in molarity of a solution prepared by diluting 2.50 mL of 3.00 M KCl(aq) up to 0.175 L final volume? You can use the dilution equation, $M_1 V_1 = M_2 V_2$. In this problem, the initial molarity is 3 ...

Working with Stock Solutions. We define a stock solution as a concentrate, that is, a solution to be diluted to some lower concentration for actual use. We may use just the stock solution or use it as a component in a more complex solution. We refer to the solution that we end up using as a working solution.

Solutions and dilutions: working with stock solutions

In determining the volume of stock solution that was needed, we had to divide the desired number of moles of glucose by the concentration of the stock solution to obtain the appropriate units. Also, the number of moles of solute in 258 mL of the stock solution is the same as the number of moles in 2500 mL of the more dilute solution; only the amount of solvent has changed .

Antibiotic concentration from stock solution practice problem An antibiotic (erythromycin) used during a conjugation experiment is stored as a stock solution of 25 mg/ml. You are pouring plates from a 200 ml flask of molten agar and need an antibiotic concentration of 20 µg/ml in the plates.

Antibiotic concentration from stock solution practice problem

If the stock solution is 10.0% KCl and the final volume and concentration need to be 100 mL and 0.50%, respectively, then it is an easy calculation to determine how much stock solution to use: $(10\%)(V_1 = (0.50\%)(100 \text{ mL})$ $V_1 = 5$ mL.

Example #7: Calculate the final concentration if 2.00 L of 3.00 M NaCl, 4.00 L of 1.50 M NaCl and 4.00 L of water are mixed. Assume there is no volume contraction upon mixing. The solution to this problem is almost exactly the same as 10a. The only "problem child" appears to be the 4.00 L of water.
